A Message from Vicar Nathaniel

“In Between Days”

Do you remember that old Country Time Lemonade commercial from back in 1993? The one where the guy with the relaxing, grandfatherly voice said, “Summer is just a page-turn away on the kitchen calendar”? Well, folks, the calendar page is turning.

Faith Night has wrapped up for the 2021-2022 school year. A fresh cohort of Confirmands have taken their place as adult members of the St. Peter’s community. Plans are being finalized for Vacation Bible School in June and the Youth Trip to Eureka Springs in July. My children occasionally choose to wear shorts to school.

Summer can sometimes be an example of what people who like big words like to call a *liminal space*, which is just a fancy term for *an in-between time*. It comes from the Latin word for *threshold* – literally stepping from one space into another. One thing has ended, but the next thing has not yet begun. A liminal space can be a time of renewal and rest, a time to break out of old habits and routines, a time to strike out in a new direction and have an adventure. It can also be scary, or frustrating, as whatever comfort we took from routine falls away.

The Bible is filled with accounts of people navigating liminal spaces. The Israelites’ forty-year exodus in the Wilderness was a liminal space. So was the time between God giving Moses the Law and Jesus coming to fulfill the law (Matthew 5:17), and the time between Jesus’ death and his resurrection.

The community of St. Peter’s is entering a liminal space, too. Pastor Don’s call at St. Peter’s has ended, and my internship here will conclude on July 31. St. Peter’s will soon begin a time of intentional transition, where the congregation will work together with an interim pastor and the staff of the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin to prepare for the next full-time pastoral call.

St. Peter’s will have the opportunity to reflect on its strengths and priorities as a congregation, and to consider ways that the Holy Spirit might be calling everyone in new or newly-focused directions.

Whatever you might be feeling about this journey through liminal space, please know that you are not alone as you travel. Your St. Peter’s community is with you. Bishop Joy, Marie Leafblad, and the rest of the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin are with you. Most importantly, God is with you, today and every day, bearing your burdens, sharing your sorrows, and taking delight in your joys.

Whatever the season, whatever the circumstances, we are supported by the people around us and the love of the One who created, redeemed, and sustains us. Thanks be to God!

Further updates will be provided to the congregation as they are known; but feel free to ask questions along the way.

Fun Facts about Father's Day

First local Father's Day was celebrated on June 19, 1910, in Spokane, Washington.

Father's Day was first celebrated on the third Sunday of June.

Sonora Louise Smart Dodd, of Spokane, Washington, started the tradition of Father's Day in the honor of her dad, William Smart, a widowed Civil War veteran.

In 1916, US President Woodrow Wilson approved the idea of observing an annual Father's Day.

In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge made Father's Day a national event.

In 1966 President Lyndon Johnson signed a presidential proclamation declaring the 3rd Sunday of June as Father's Day.

Father's Day is the fifth most popular card-sending holiday, with an estimated \$100 million in card sales. Husbands, grandfathers, uncles, sons and sons-in-law are honored as well as father. Each year, 7 million Father's Day cards are sent in the UK, compared to 13 million Mother's Day cards.

Roses are the official flower for Father's Day. A red rose is worn in the lapel if your father is living, a white rose if he is deceased.

This is a big day for the 66.3 million fathers in America.

While not everyone in America is a fan of Father's Day, 72 percent of Americans plan to celebrate or acknowledge Father's Day.

The necktie is the most popular and number one of all Father's Day gifts according to the U.S. Census Bureau. Hammers and golf clubs are also popular presents for the day.

According to greetings card makers Hallmark, Father's Day is the fifth-largest card-sending holiday.

These days, fathers are generally three years younger where births occur outside marriage. The average age of the father where the birth occurred outside marriage decreased from 28 to 26 between 1971 and 1991 but had since increased to almost 28 again in 1999.

As the idea of Father's Day was conceived by Sonora Dodd of Spokane, Washington, to honor her father, she chose his birthday which was proclaimed on June 19, 1910, by Spokane's mayor as the first Father's Day.

The first presidential proclamation honoring fathers was issued in 1966 when President Lyndon Johnson designated the third Sunday in June as Father's Day. Father's Day has been celebrated annually since 1972 when President Richard Nixon signed the public law that made it permanent.
