Nathan's Notions

Let freedom ring! We have probably sung those words many times throughout our lifetime as we worshipped the Lord singing "My Country, 'tis of thee, Sweet land of liberty, Of thee I sing: Land where my fathers died, Land of the pilgrim's pride, From ev'ry mountainside Let freedom ring!"

How can we let freedom ring?

We can let freedom ring by having a personal relationship with Jesus as Savior. We cannot tell others about the freedom we enjoy in Christ if we ourselves have not experienced it. Some people have attended church for years only to find out that they had never experienced salvation.

We can also let freedom ring by telling others what Jesus has done for us, and sharing the gospel. Some find it hard to begin a conversation about spiritual things, but it can actually come naturally when you become intentional about it. We find it easy to talk about things we have an interest in and those things about which we feel passionately. We as Christians should have an enormous amount of interest in the eternal destiny of others around us. And it only takes one good experience of sharing your faith to get you passionate about doing it again.

How do we let freedom ring?

By leading each conversation we have into talking about spiritual things. For the times that you do not have a lot of time, you can do so rather quickly by asking a series of questions beginning with, "Do you ever think about spiritual things?" You will know in a matter of seconds of whether to proceed

or to back off based upon the words and body language of the person you have just asked that question. If you feel led to continue then ask, "To you, who is Jesus?" Once they give their response ask if you can share with them about your personal relationship with Jesus, and then ask them if anything similar has happened to them. If not, then ask, "Would you like to know how you can have a personal relationship with Jesus?" If they say yes, then share with them the gospel.

For the opportunities you have more time to talk with people you can use FIRE to lead up to the question about spiritual things. FIRE is an acronym for Family/Familiar, Interests, Religious background, and Exploratory questions. Whichever route you choose, make a point this Summer to let freedom ring!

DMBA Executive Board Meeting May 10, 2021 First Baptist Church Shea Hicks, Moderator

Call to Order

The Meeting was called to order by Bro. Shea Hicks. Bob Farmer welcomed the Executive Board. Members and guests were encouraged to sign in.

Recognition of New Staff and Board Members: Shane Webb, Executive Board Member; Ryan Seaman, Interim Student Pastor at Buck Creek.

Approval of Minutes from Previous Board Meetings: The Minutes of the March 8 Business Meeting were approved with a motion from Mike Jones and a second from Dennis McFadden.

Finance Committee Report: Bro. Jarrod Carter presented the finance report. It was approved. The Finance Committee made a motion to increase budget line EX8910 from \$3500 to \$5500 to cover associational mileage for the remainder of the fiscal year and to cover expenses incurred from the SBC in Nashville, TN in June. This motion passed.

AMS Report: Bro. Nathan Whisnant, along with a written report of his activities from March-April, gave a verbal report about a Pancake Breakfast at Camp Schafer on May 22, a Sunday School Training on May 24 on How to Do SS after Covid, a Bi-Vocational Pastors and Family Lunch at Camp Schafer on June 19, about his willingness to help churches in Evangelism and his role in the Associational Office until someone is hired to replace Leslie Rice.

Reports of Ministries

Bro. Nathan Whisnant gave a Baptist Center Report about the centers increase in activities helping people with food and clothing. He also gave a report about the KWC Campus activities. They will be evaluating this ministry at the end of this week and this past year's success. There are more things planned in the fall concerning Back to School bags and a workday for a new building they are using.

Bro. Brian Hamby presented thre resolutions from the Resolution Committee expressing great appreciation to Mrs. Leslie Rice, Mrs. Betty Keiser, and Mrs. Dorothy Walker for their many years of service. These resolutions all passed. A Special Gift and Prayer was presented to Mrs. Leslie Rice upon her retirement by Bro. Richard Sams.

Bro. Wendell Wood gave a report about the Block Party Trailer and encouraged churches to use it. He also reported a gift of \$1,000 was given to the Association from the KBC WMU to help churches use the trailer that may not be able to afford to rent it.

Cortney & Tim Brown gave a Camp Schafer report about a full summer camp that is being planned and the workday on May 22.

Mrs. Sharon Westerfield presented a motion as a joint recommendation from the Camp Development Committee, the Camp Program Committee, the Trustees, and the Finance Committee to move forward with the plans for the Camp Lodge. Bro. Wendell Wood with a second from Jerry Carter amended this motion asking the committee report back at the July Executive Board. This motion and its amendment passed.

Bro. Brian Roberts gave an Evangelism report about the One-Night Revival that was held at Livermore BC and Macedonia BC. He suggested churches consider having Multi-Night revivals with other churches in their area.

Bro. Ben White gave a Mission report about plans concerning short term mission projects.

Bro. Mike Jones gave a report from the KBC Mission Board and many ministries and Great Giving this passed year.

Bro Jerry Carter gave a Nominating Committee report. He also presented a motion from the committee to approve, Joanne Kendall from Cedar Street to the Missions Development Committee. The Jail Ministry Christmas Project now has Byron & Leslie Rice serving as directors.

Bro. Richard Sams presented a joint motion from the Personnel Committee and the Budget & Finance Committee to change the full time Associational Ministry Administrator Position to a part time Associational Administrative Coordinator and to hire a third-party vendor to provide bookkeeping and financial services on behalf of the DMBA. This motion passed. A job description is available in the DMBA office.

Bro. Mike Ponton gave a Trustees report concerning work they have done and projects they are considering.

Mrs. Cathy Chinn gave a WMU report concerning May 15 WMU upcoming Associational Training event in Elizabeth-town. Several from our association attended the State WMU meeting in Shelbyville. Brenda McKinney & Diane Thacker were elected to serve on the Executive Board from the Western Ky Region. Mrs. Cathy Chinn will continue to serve in another type of position. Pastors and churches are encouraged to call on the WMU leadership if they need any kind of help with mission activities.

Bro. Wayne Morris gave a Youth Committee report about a Youth Worship Rally that was on February 24th and A Youth Discipleship Training Event on May 2.

Churches and Youth are in encourage to Go Serve in their communities on July 17 and then join in a celebration on July 18 at Island Baptist Church sharing their Go Serve Projects.

Old Business - There was none.

New Business- Bro. Shea Hicks serving as moderator created a "Collegiate Ministry Committee". The following have been asked to serve on this committee, Shane Kahkola (Walnut Memorial, Ryan Seaman (Buck Creek), Connor Reed (Macedonia), Caleb Holt (Bellevue) and Auston Babb (Redhill).

Adjourn- The meeting was adjourned on a motion from Bro. Dennis McFadden and a second from Brian Roberts. This motion passed. A Closing Prayer was given.

Please keep us in prayer in these endeavors.



Block Party Trailer




The Block Party Trailer is a great tool that can be used to reach your church field for Christ.

Dental Mission Update June 2021

Greetings! Our dental clinic is fully operational now and ready to reach the people of our local communities who are struggling with oral health needs and without funds and insurance! We have been treating patients since April of this year after about six months closure during the pandemic. All of our volunteers were vaccinated by March and many of them at the McLean County Health Department.

There have been some exciting physical developments for the clinic to include the DMBA-funded improvements to our clinic bathroom with new vanity and sink, handicapped toilet, and soon the installation of motion-sensor paper towel dispenser and soap dispenser for better infection control and cleanliness for our patients and volunteers! We also have a new HVAC system after our old system failed and will assure predictable service for years to come! Our digital radiography and new computers continue to offer modern quality of care and diagnostic help for our patients.

Our volunteer team has recently added a registered dental hygienist who will fill a critical need since our previous hygienist had to leave our volunteer team about 18 months ago. We still have two dentists serving with their separate teams, but **pray** for two more dentists and volunteers to form two more teams.

Our usual referral source for patients has been the Help Office of Owensboro, but since the pandemic, they have closed those services and hope to return to normal staffing and services by January 2022. **Pray** that they might be able to return sooner to the financial screening that they have done in the past for our patients.

We have also created a "smile ministry" fund for helping our patients with missing teeth in their smile by taking impressions and having an acrylic "flipper" appliance fabricated and placed. These appliances continue to give back to patients their self-confidence and smiles and has given us an opportunity to show the love of Christ! It has been very rewarding to see hope restored for many through this ministry, and to have continued opportunities to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ through dentistry!
