


Our Mission: In joy, we share Christ's truth

Remembering the Sabbath

I've been reading "Words of Love", subtitled "A Healing Journey with the Ten Commandments" by E. Gamble. She refers to the Commandments as Words of God. She is sometimes wordy in discussing a particular Word, and sometimes stretches the meaning a little too far (in my opinion), but one Word discussion which really impressed me was Remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy.

She explains how this Word is the connecting link between the first three Words and the ones that follow. The first three concern our personal relationship to God, while the following ones concern our relationship with community. To quote: "The Fourth Word links personal practice with community piety to help us understand that our love story is not exclusively personal. It is always lived out in community. In the same way, worship is not essentially personal."

There is a rhythm to life – there are highs and lows, and work and rest. God worked creating the world in six days, and then took a rest. Obviously, our society does not take a day to rest, and unfortunately, we can get caught up in not taking a day to rest. Those of us who work probably need a Sunday afternoon to catch up on chores. And us retired folks can also get caught up in being busy. But ironically, the busier we are, the more we need Sabbath time. She noted that Martin Luther once remarked "that he was so busy he needed to pray for two hours instead of one."

So, how can you keep the Sabbath? Well, if you can't take a whole day, take small steps. For example:

- 1. Attend Sunday worship. As noted above, one worships in a community. I've always found that taking about 2 hours to worship and reflect on what is most important in life tends to re-center me for the week.
- 2. If you have to do chores, then select ones that are enjoyable and relaxing. Work in the garden if that is your hobby. Wash the car with your children or grandchildren. Put on some religious music if you must clean house. Don't scrape paint or sign in to the office.
- 3. Spread out your Sabbath by participating in mid-week services and refocus on God for a while.
- 4. Sit on your porch listening to the sounds of the neighborhood and nature.
- 5. Go for a relaxing walk through your neighborhood. Turn the Fitbit off!
- 6. The education committee is periodically hosting a Sabbath Sunday Supper. You do need to eat, so come and bring the family.


