Sheriff Dart Launches Missing Persons Project

prioritize long unsolved cases of missing people, the Cook County Sheriff Tom Dart has launched the Missing Persons Project.

Resources will be dedicated to the search of people who have been missing for three or more years, with an initial focus on missing women. Investigators will be assigned to help with unsolved cases and work with local law enforcement agencies.

These are incredibly challenging cases to solve and behind each of them are family and friends just left devastated and worrying with no answers," Sheriff Dart said.

Cases that have often lacked widespread media attention will be featured on the Office's new Missing Persons website and social media channels in an effort to generate tips.

According to the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System (NamUs), 170 people from Cook County have been missing for three years or longer, including 77 women and 93 men.

Sheriff's Office investigators have been working on the case of 56 year old Viola Martin, who was

For Property Tax

Cook County Treas-urer Maria Pappas has mailed out nearly 1.8 million Second Installment property tax bills with payments due Oct. 1st.

The new bills will bring the total amount billed countywide for 2020 to more than \$16.1 billion, an increase of more than 3.4 percent from last year. A recent analysis by the Treasurer's Office found the tax increase is hitting commercial property owners and Black and Latino suburban property owners the hardest.

Taxpayers may use cookcountvtreasurer.com to search for \$72 million in available refunds going back 20 years and to verify property tax exemptions, which can lower the tax bill.

Select the purple box labeled "Your Property Tax Overview". Search by property address or enter your Property Index Number. Look for the results under "Are There Any Overpay-ments on Your PIN?" or the results under "Have You Re-ceived Your Exemptions in These Tax Years?"

Late payments are charged 1.5 percent per month.

Exemptions For Property Tax

As homeowners in Cook County receive their 2020 Second Installment Tax Bills in the mail, they are encouraged to look at the bottom left corner to ensure that the correct exemption(s) are applied.

If a homeowner believes they are entitled to an exemption that is not reflected on their tax bill, they can apply for a Certificate of Error which provides an opportunity to redeem missing exemptions for up to three years in addition to the current

tax year. Applications with copies of supporting documentation can be filed online, by mail, or in person. The full list of exemp-

tions can be viewed at cookcountvassessor.com/ exemptions.

In addition to the Homeowner and Senior exemptions, the Assessor's Office processed auto-renewals for the "Senior Freeze", Veterans with Disabilities, and Persons with Disabilities exemptions.

Homeowners are responsible for paying the entirety of the tax bill to the Cook County Treasurer's Office by October 1, 2021. If the Certificate of Error application is granted, either a corrected tax bill or a refund for the difference will be issued.






