

Offering Ourselves to God

I want to say thanks to each of you who faithfully serve in the DMBA for offering yourselves to God. If you serve as a pastor or staff person you could have chosen so many things to do with your life, yet you decided to spend your life following God and increasing His kingdom. If you serve as a layperson, you could find multiple ways to spend your time, yet you choose to use it to help build the kingdom of God.

We can learn some lessons about offering ourselves to God from Leviticus 1:1-17. The principles God laid out for the priests to conduct burnt sacrifices can apply to us today in three simple ways: the nature of offering ourselves to God (1:1-4), the manner of offering ourselves to God (1:5-12), and the effect of offering ourselves to God (1:13-17)

We must offer ourselves to God in a voluntary and complete way, with sincere and complete devotion to Him. I have seen many people who serve in the DMBA do these very things, and it brings me much joy.

In what manner should we offer ourselves to God? By death of our old self (Galatians 2:20). What effect comes from offering ourselves to God? It pleases God (II Corinthians 2:15), it satisfies our conscious (II Timothy 4:17), and it motivates others to offer themselves to God (Philippians 3:17).

As a leader in the Daviess-Mclean Baptist Association lead by example in offering your entire self to God without hesitation. A lot of you already have and you have seen the effects it has had on your relationship with God and those around you. Now, let's all make a point to do this, and watch what God will do in and through our association!




