



Kirk Muller

Kirk reached the pinnacle of hockey by winning the Stanley Cup with the hallowed Montreal Canadiens in 1993. In the 1984 draft, he was chosen #2 overall by the New Jersey Devils behind some guy named Mario Lemieux! He was named captain of the Devils at the age of 21 and that gave rise to his nickname “Captain Kirk”.

Muller played 19 NHL seasons for the Devils, Canadiens, Dallas Stars, Florida Panthers, New York Islanders and Toronto Maple Leafs. In 1,349 games in my career, he scored 357 goals and 602 assists for a total of 959 points. His aggressive edge and willingness to protect his teammates meant that he also collected 1,228 penalty minutes.

Kirk played for my country of Canada on six different occasions in the World Championships, World Junior Championships and Olympic Games.

Following his playing career, he began coaching. In addition to coaching at university, in international tournaments and in the AHL, he was head the head coach of the Carolina Hurricanes for 3 seasons. Muller also served as an associate coach for the Habs and St. Louis Blues and is currently an associate coach for the Calgary Flames.
