Kingslee Heights Townhomes Landscape Standards July 2020

Overview:

In 2019, the Kingslee Heights Board approved an expenditure for a plan to update the landscaping around the perimeter of the complex. In addition, plans were developed as guidance for homeowners who wanted to plant around their units. A meeting was held with interested homeowners to develop guiding principles for the designer to follow. The main principles that were developed are:

- 1. Ease of maintenance
- 2. Manicured appearance (as opposed to a prairie look)
- 3. Pollinator friendly
- 4. Seasonal color
- 5. Set plans so that residents would not be delayed waiting for board approval.

In addition, having a set plan provides for a uniform appearance throughout the complex.

Application:

Provided these standards are followed, Board approval is not required.

These standards apply to all new landscaping immediately around individual homes.

Removal of existing planted areas is not required, however if existing plantings are changed the standards must be followed.

The landscape area should be no more than 5 feet from an individual home, or as depicted on the accompanying plans (which is often less than 5 feet).

Landscaping outside of the area immediately adjacent to a home is only permitted with Board approval.

Responsibility:

The homeowner is responsible for:

- maintaining rock and mulch at a 2" depth. This is required per our lawn care contract to help keep weeds at a manageable level.
- Maintaining the general appearance of the landscape bed

Landscape Design:

Landscape diagrams were developed for both sunny and shady exposures. Some units may require a mixture of both. The plans can be followed as is for those who do not care to do the design themselves, or the plants in the plan can be used to develop your own layout. Use of approved plants and materials will not require board approval. Any deviations from plants and materials as listed below will not be considered, however the Board may amend the list of approved plants from time to time.

Materials:

Weed cloth:

• A good quality weed cloth should be used prior to putting down mulch or rock.

Edging:

• All areas should be edged with standard black poly landscape edging

Landscape Rock:

- For areas where there is not currently rock, 1.5" River Rock is the approved rock to use. This was chosen because it is less porous and will look nicer for a longer period of time.
- For areas where there is existing rock, new rock should be the same type as what is currently in the adjacent area.

Mulch:

• Natural Shredded Hardwood mulch should be used at a minimum depth of 2".
