



Prince Amukamara

Prince is a recently retired former Super Bowl champion with the New York Giants. The cornerback was drafted in the first round by the Giants in the 2011 NFL draft out of the University of Nebraska where as a senior he was a unanimous first-team All American and the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year.

It was in his rookie season of 2011 that Prince had the thrill of winning the Super Bowl in an upset of the favoured New England Patriots. Injuries hampered Amukamara's first two seasons in New York but when healthy, he was a starting cornerback by the start of his third season. Leg injuries, a common hazard in the NFL, were a recurring trouble for him over his career.

After five seasons with the Giants, Prince signed with the Jacksonville Jaguars as a highly-sought free agent. Here he was named the starting nickelback in a stout Jags defense.



For the 2017 season, Amukamara signed with the Chicago Bears where he spent the next three seasons. It was with the Bears that Prince arguably had his best seasons which included a Pick-6 of Russell Wilson on Monday Night Football. In the 2018 season, Pro Football Focus gave him the 9th highest grade of any cornerback that season. Since the NFL is a business, Amukamara was a victim of the salary cap after the 2019 season.

As a Christian, Prince states "My faith is my life. It makes up everything about me. Christ is the most important part of my life." He continues, "The feeling of winning the Super Bowl went away pretty quickly," he said. "I don't think about it much unless people remind me, but to be a Christian, that's a daily thing and that's what I think about the most."
