In connection with the current construction of a new K-2 school building (the "Project") by the Amanda-Clearcreek Local School District, which is ongoing at the school lot and adjacent property located on Walnut Street, Amanda, Ohio, the Village of Amanda has reported receiving complaints regarding disturbing noise and/or lighting during late evening hours and has expressed a concern that those construction operations involving disturbing noise and/or lighting be terminated at a reasonable time each day. The Village of Amanda has proposed to enact emergency noise legislation and to seek an injunction to halt construction in the event that these concerns of the Village of Amanda are not resolved.

The Board of Education of the Amanda Clearcreek Local School District is a co-owner with the Ohio School Facilities Commission of the Project on the site described above in the Village of Amanda. Smoot Construction Company of Ohio is the construction manager for the construction project and manages the work of the individual prime contractors working on the project on behalf of the Board of Education and the Ohio School Facilities Commission. As part of its management responsibilities, Smoot Construction establishes the working hours for construction activities and manages the contractors performing work on the Project. The Board of Education further agrees, absent an emergency requiring immediate action to protect persons and/or property, that there shall be no disturbing noise and no lighting on the construction site by contractors under contract with the Board of Education for the Project during the following hours: (i) between 8:00 p.m., or 9:00 p.m. during June, July and August, on Sunday through Thursday, and 7:00 a.m. on Monday through Friday; and (ii) between 8:00 p.m., or 9:00 p.m. during June, July and August, on Fridays, Saturdays, and the evenings before legal holidays, and 9:00 a.m. Saturdays, Sundays and the morning of legal holidays. In the event of an emergency requiring immediate action to protect persons and/or property of the School District, the Village and landowners in the vicinity of the Project, the Board of Education will notify the named representative of the Village of Amanda and also any adjacent landowners of the nature of the situation and the steps to be taken to minimize any disturbance.

CONSTITUTION WEEK FACTS

What is a proclamation?

A proclamation is an official public announcement, usually issued by mayors, governors, etc.

Why does the DAR actively promote Constitution Week?

Constitution Week was initiated by the Daughters of the American Revolution. The DAR is a patriotic organization that encourages education and historic preservation in communities across America.

How did Constitution Week begin?

In 1955, the President General of the Daughters of the American Revolution, Gertrude S. Carraway, adopted a project to promote the observance of the U.S. Constitution with a memorial week beginning on the anniversary of the signing of this document, September 17. She asked DAR chapters, committees, and members to study, teach, and discuss the U.S. Constitution. Caraway also encouraged members to invite their governors and mayors to issue proclamations celebrating the Constitution.

When did the United States government begin to observe Constitution Week?

Constitution Week was officially declared by President Eisenhower on August 2, 1956. This was the culmination of a proposal the DAR sent through Senator William F. Knowland of California.

Is there a memorial honoring the Constitution?

Yes. DAR Constitution Hall in Washington, D.C. The inscription on the pediment reads, "Constitution Hall – a memorial to that immortal document, the Constitution of the United States, in which are incorporated the principles of freedom, equality and justice for which our forefathers strove." DAR Constitution Hall is the only structure dedicated to the U.S. Constitution.

How can I celebrate Constitution Week?

- · Provide local media with the Constitution Week press release and FAQ sheet.
- Encourage your local government representatives to issue a proclamation about Constitution Week.
- Ask the school principals in your community to observe Constitution Week by issuing a school proclamation encouraging staff to teach the Constitution.
- · Urge children to study the Constitution with their personal proclamation pledge.
- Contact your local DAR chapter and invite them to give a program on the Constitution.

That the LGA hereby approves the construction of the aforesaid <u>WATER FACILILTIES</u> in cooperation with the OWDA under the provisions, terms and conditions set forth in the "Cooperative Agreement for State Construction Project" as set forth in Exhibit A (the "Cooperative Agreement") and hereby authorizes the Chief Executive Officer and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the LGA to execute the Cooperative Agreement with the OWDA substantially in the form set forth in Exhibit A.

Section 2. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this resolution were passed in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3. That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of said <u>VILLAGE</u> for the reason that the immediate construction of the <u>WATER FACILLITIES</u> at the earliest possible time is necessary in order to protect the health of the inhabitants of the LGA by providing <u>THE ADEQUATE SUPPLY AND DISTIRBUTION OF WATER</u>; wherefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and immediately after its passage.

Credit Cards

The Village of Amanda does have credit card accounts established with cards issued to the Fiscal Officer, Administrator, Water/Sewer Superintendent, Street Department, and Mayor. These are solely for the purchase of items relating to the village use. Examples include, but are not limited to, travel expenses, supplies, materials, and ordering materials via phone or internet as needed.

The cards are to be controlled by the above named persons. All invoices, receipts, and associated paperwork are to be turned in to the Fiscal Officer as soon as possible for Auditing purposes and to process the bill. With final approval from the village's council

Items deemed to be of personal nature will be billed to the employee and such use may also subject the employee to possible disciplinary action.

Cell Phones

Employees who are provided cell phones by the village are responsible for the care and security of the phone. Damaged or lost cell phones are to be reported immediately to their immediate supervisor, and if determined by the supervisor, the employee may be charged for the damaged or lost phone.

The Cell phones are to be used for business purposes. Employees who use the cell phone for person use; will be charged the amount exceeding the basic charge established between the village and the cell phone provider.

Employees who are deemed to be abusing the cell phone policy may be subject to disciplinary action and it may result in garnishment of wages.

Travel Policy

Employees traveling for business purpose will have to have prior approval from council. Any gasoline reimbursed will be reimbursed at the rate the state or federal government sets.

Monitoring of Bookkeeping

The Council will establish one member to monitor all record keeping on a quarterly basis. The assigned member will report to council following the quarterly check. This policy is to have a more thorough monitoring of the Fiscal Officer. The Fiscal Officer will still

report monthly to the council. The overseer will monitor of example: bank statements, payments, and receipts.

City of Lancaster Law Director Prosecution Agreement/Appointment

IN CONSIDERATION OF the mutual promises contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

I. Services

- (a) During the term of this Agreement/Appointment, Prosecutor hereby agrees that she will undertake to prosecute, by and through personnel employed by the Lancaster City Law Director & City Prosecutor's Office, all cases coming before the Fairfield County Municipal Court, Criminal Division, arising out of alleged violations of traffic and criminal ordinances of Village or traffic and criminal statutes of the State of Ohio, which occur within the limits of Village.
- (b) Prosecutor further agrees that she will, by and through the personnel assigned to duties in the Lancaster City Law Director & City Prosecutor's Office, consult with and advise all persons concerning violations of the criminal statutes of the State of Ohio, alleged to have occurred within the limits of Village, and will assist such citizens, when necessary, in the interest of justice, when requested by the local police or prosecutor, in the preparation and filing of complaints charging such offenses.
- (c) Prosecutor further agrees that she will undertake to represent the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, by and through personnel employed by the Lancaster City Law Director & City Prosecutor's Office, in all cases coming before the Fairfield County Municipal Court, Civil Division, arising out of the appeal procedures of Ohio Revised Code Sections 4511.191 and 4507.40 and in which the legal representative of Village would have a duty to represent the Bureau of Motor Vehicles.
- (d) Prosecutor hereby agrees that she will undertake to prosecute, by and through personnel employed by the Lancaster City Law Director & City Prosecutor's Office, all cases coming before the Fairfield County Municipal Court, Criminal Division, arising out of alleged criminal violations of Zoning Ordinances of Village which occur within the limits of Village.
- (e) Prosecutor further agrees that she will direct her personnel who are to perform the services contemplated by this Agreement/Appointment, to consult and advise the officers of Fairfield County Sheriff's Office, and all other appropriate officials for Village when necessary, concerning the prosecution or enforcement of the criminal and traffic statutes for the State of Ohio and ordinances of Village with the limits of Village.
- (f) It is mutually understood and agreed that the responsibility of Prosecutor under this Agreement/Appointment shall be limited to those functions set above, and specifically that she and her prosecutor or civil litigation personnel, by which she chooses to perform this Agreement/Appointment, shall not be required to engage in any investigations other than those normally performed by the Lancaster City Law Director & City Prosecutor's Office in regards to and incident to the prosecution thereby of routine cases arising in Village, the taking of

depositions, the prosecution of appeals by the plaintiff, City, or State from judgments of the Fairfield County Municipal Court, or the preparation or consideration of legislation.

- (g) The description of the services set forth may be amended only upon mutual agreement of the parties.
- (h) Prosecutor reserves the right to decline, for just and reasonable cause, to represent Village as long as written notice is provided seven (7) days before a scheduled hearing in the specific case.
- (i) Village, by and through its Solicitor, reserves the right under this Agreement/Appointment to represent Village in any specific case filed in or coming before the Fairfield County Municipal Court upon giving written notice to prosecutor seven (7) days before a scheduled hearing in that specific case that Village Solicitor intends to represent said Village within the limits of said Village. It is further mutually understood and agreed that, notwithstanding any of the above provisions of this Agreement/Appointment, Village shall have the absolute right, in its sole discretion, to undertake to prosecute by and through the Village Solicitor, any case coming before the Fairfield County Municipal Court, arising out of alleged violations of the Codified Ordinance of Village, or alleged violations of the traffic and criminal statutes of the State of Ohio, which occur within the limits of Village or any appeal from judgments of the Fairfield County Municipal Court relating thereto.
- (j) Village shall reimburse Prosecutor costs related to the expert witness fees and other extraordinary prosecution costs up to a maximum amount of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00). Village may reimburse such costs beyond the maximum amount of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) upon the prior approval and at the discretion of the Village Solicitor. Prosecutor shall provide an invoice to Village for actual expenses incurred under this section. For purposes of this Agreement/Appointment only, a detailed invoice shall include the amount owed by Village, the detailed list of the services provided, and the dates for which the services were performed.

II. Fee for Services

In consideration of Prosecutor's performance of the services detailed in Article 1, Village shall pay Prosecutor the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) for the term of this Agreement/Appointment. Said fees shall be made payable to the City of Lancaster, and sent to Terre L. Vandervoort, City of Lancaster Law Director & City Prosecutor's Office, P. O. Box 1008, Lancaster, Ohio 43130, for deposit to the Treasure of Lancaster on or before January 30, 2008.

III. Relationship of Parties

Prosecutor shall be free to contract for similar services to be performed for other governmental entities while Lancaster is under this Agreement/Appointment with Village. Prosecutor shall not participate in any pension plans, bonus, stock, or other benefits that Village provides for its employees. In performance of duties within the scope of this Agreement/Appointment, the Prosecutor and her personnel shall be regarded as representatives of Village and serve as Village's appointed official for such tasks.

IV. Liability

The parties agree that the Prosecutor, its employees, representatives, agents, officers, or directors, when working on cases that originate within the jurisdiction of Village and that are handled through

prosecutorial work in the Fairfield County Municipal Court, shall be regarded as Village's appointed official and shall be protected from any liability, claim, loss, expense, judgment, settlement, or damage arising from negligent acts or omissions to act in cases that are within the scope of and in furtherance of the Agreement/Appointment.

V. Term of Agreement/Appointment; Termination

- (a) The terms of this Agreement/Appointment shall be for a period of one (1) year commencing on January 1, 2008, and ending on December 31, 2008. This Agreement/Appointment shall automatically renew for additional one (1) year periods unless terminated by either party pursuant to Section V (b). Upon such automatic renewal, the terms of the Agreement/Appointment shall remain the same as provided herein, subject to any written amendment by the parties as provided in Section VI (g).
- (b) This Agreement/Appointment may be terminated upon the occurrence of any of the following events:
 - (i) In the event, either party shall breach or fail to comply with any provision of this Agreement/Appointment and such breach or failure shall continue for a period of ten (10) days after the giving of notice hereof by the other party, the other party may terminate this Agreement/Appointment immediately upon the giving of notice of termination to the defaulting party.
 - (ii) If either party becomes the subject of State or Federal insolvency, bankruptcy, receivership or similar proceeding, the other party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement/Appointment immediately upon notice to the subject party.
 - (iii) After December 31, 2008, the Agreement/Appointment may be terminated at any time by either party for any reason upon written notice provided to the other party at least thirty (30) days prior to such termination. Should either party terminate the Agreement/Appointment after December 21, 2008, Village shall pay prosecutor a pro-rated share of Fee for Services as outlined in Section II.

VI. Miscellaneous

- (a) During the term of this Agreement/Appointment, if Prosecutor agrees to provide assistance to Village in addition to Services specified above, upon mutual agreement of the parties, such assistance will be provided by Prosecutor in accordance with the quotation made by Prosecutor to Village for such assistance.
- (b) Employees of Prosecutor who perform any Services shall at all times be considered and remain employees of Prosecutor, and the act of performing any Services hereunder shall in no way make such persons employees of Village for any purpose.
- (c) Prosecutor shall not be liable for any delay or failure in performance of its obligations hereunder caused by strikes or other labor disputes, riots or other public disorders, governmental or legal regulations or prohibitions, fire or other casualty or other causes beyond its control, whether similar or dissimilar to those enumerated.
- (d) This Agreement/Appointment may not be assigned, transferred or vested upon another by either party without the prior written consent of the other party subject to the foregoing, this Agreement

shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their representative, successors, and assigns.

(e) Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Agreement/Appointment shall be in writing and shall be delivered personally or mailed registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the party for whom intended at such address as such party shall designate for the purpose of written notice to the other party, and shall be deemed to have been effectively given to the recipient party on the date such notice is personally delivered or is placed in the custody of the U.S. Postal Service.

- (f) This Agreement/Appointment sets forth the full and entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior proposals, communications, agreements, negotiations or understandings, whether oral or written, with respect to the subject matter hereof. No changes, alterations, modifications, additions, or qualifications to the terms of this Agreement/Appointment shall be made or be binding unless upon mutual agreement, made in writing and signed by all of the parties.
- (g) This Agreement/Appointment may not be varied by any other document issued by either party, and may be amended or modified only by means of written instrument which is signed by both parties and which refers specifically to this Agreement/Appointment and expressly states that an amendment or modification to this Agreement/Appointment is being made in the respects set forth in such instrument.
- (h) This Agreement/Appointment shall be governed by Ohio law and it is specifically agreed that property venue for any legal action shall be Fairfield County, Ohio.
- (i) All disputes, differences, and controversies arising out of or connection with this Agreement/Appointment shall be settled and finally determined by arbitration with Fairfield County, under the then existing Rules of the American Arbitration Association.
- (j) During the performance of this agreement/Appointment, the parties agree to comply with Federal and State non-discrimination provisions as required by law, and fully incorporated herein.
- (k) The Agreement/Appointment documents consist of this Agreement/Appointment, conditions of the Agreement/Appointment (general, supplementary, and other conditions,) drawings, specifications, all addenda issued prior to execution of this Agreement/Appointment, and modifications issued subsequent to such execution, bid documents, and responses to request for proposals. These documents form the Agreement/Appointment, and all are a part of the Agreement/Appointment as if attached to this Agreement/Appointment.

- (1) If any term, covenant, warranty, paragraph, clause, condition, or provision of this Agreement/Appointment is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remainder of the provisions of this Agreement/Appointment shall remain in full force and effect and shall in no way be affected, impaired, or invalidated and this Agreement/Appointment shall be construed as if the invalid, void, or unenforceable provision were omitted.
- (m) This Agreement/Appointment shall be binding upon, and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and to their respective successors and assignees permitted under the terms of this Agreement/Appointment.

WHEREAS, the Fairfield County Board of Commissioners (hereinafter the "Board") is mandated under R.C. 1901.34(C) to reimburse the Lancaster City Law Director's Office (hereinafter the "Law Director") for prosecuting those cases arising from criminal and other offenses that occur in the unincorporated areas and villages within Fairfield County, Ohio and may reimburse the Law Director for prosecuting those misdemeanor and other offenses that occur in the unincorporated areas and villages within Fairfield County, Ohio and outside the City of Lancaster (collectively "Prosecution Services") for which the Law Director has, by contract, agreed to prosecute; and

WHEREAS, the Law Director has contracted with each and every village within Fairfield County, Ohio (collectively, "the Villages") to provide such Prosecution Services (all of such contracts between the Law Director and the Villages hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Contracts"); and

WHEREAS, the maximum amount to be paid by the Board to the Law Director for the provision of Prosecution Services by the Law Director pursuant to this contract is Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00).

THEREFORE, for the promises contained herein and other adequate consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- A. The Board shall pay One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) per year ("the Annual Payment") for five (5) years to the Law Director and, in exchange therefore, the Law Director (1) shall prosecute all misdemeanor and other offenses other than felonies arising in the unincorporated areas and the Villages of Fairfield County, Ohio and (2) shall further provide those legal services designated in the Contracts, all at no additional cost to the Board.
- B. The Annual Payment shall be paid in two (2) equal installments of Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) from the Fairfield County General Fund. The first installment of the Annual Payment shall be made during the first quarter of the fiscal year and the second installment of the Annual Payment shall be made during the third quarter of the fiscal year. The funds to pay for this contract have been allocated by the Board.
