Mayor Bateman submitted his annual report as follows: To the Council of the Village of Amanda Ohio
 The past year has been in many ways a progressive one for our village, improvements in streets, side walks and buildings have been made, but few of the ordinances have been violated and all offenders have been punished, except in the case of the violation of Ordinance No XVII. requiring the paving of the side walks on East Main Street

The following is a statement of all monies collected by me, said Mayor, and paid to the Treas. viz

I would recommend the enforcement of ordinance No. XVII and resolutions requiring the paving of side walks on East Main Street, and also recommend the paving of side walks on the west side of East Street, from Church or South Street to first alley north of High Street, and to complete the paving of the side walks on the west side of Center Street from the terminal of Ballhausen's paving to High street. And further I would recommend some means of Fire Protection for the village; I want to return to the council my sincere thanks for the faithful services rendered me during my administration. We have not accomplished all that we desired but I feel that we have put forth an honest effort, and done the best we could. And now as our official relations are severed ^{before of our} I do not expect to lose my interest in the village, I would.

By motions the clerk was instructed to prepare an ordinance prohibiting the promiscuous use of fire arms within the incorporation, and procure a seal for the mayor. To require property owners to keep gutters and sidewalks free from obstructions, rubbish, snow, etc.
Be it ordained by the Council of the village of Amanda, Fairfield County, Ohio.

Sec. 1. That it shall be the duty of the owner or occupier of any lot or part of lot in said village which bounds or abuts upon any street, square, or public place of said village, the sidewalks of which shall have been paved or graveled, and the gutters of which shall have been established, shall keep or cause to be kept, the said sidewalks and gutters free from and clean from all rubbish, grass, weeds, snow or other obstruction.

Sec. 2. Within the first four hours of daylight after any snow shall have ceased the person or persons named in section one shall remove or cause to be removed from sidewalks in section named, all or so much of the snow thereon as may be necessary to provide safe and convenient foot path over such sidewalk.

Sec. 3. In case of any of the persons mentioned in sections one and two shall refuse or neglect to clean his, or their gutters or sidewalks and keep the same thereafter cleaned as in said sections required, it shall be the duty of the street commissioner to notify the person or persons therein named to clean the same; and in case said person or persons refuse or neglect to comply for (24) twenty four hours after receiving such notice it shall be the duty of said street commissioner to cause said gutter or sidewalk to be cleaned and the cost thereof is hereby made a charge against the owner or owners of said lot or part of a lot in front of which the labor is performed and is also made a lien upon said lot, or part of a lot should the owner or owners of said lot or part of a lot refuse or neglect to pay the cost of cleaning said gutter or sidewalk as aforesaid, the same shall be collected and the lien enforced by suit as in case of paving sidewalks and gutters.

Sec. 4. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after the earliest pierce allowed by law.
