CALL TO ORDER

Wayne Olsen, Mayor called meeting to order at 6:00p.m.

RECOGNITION OF VISITORS

No visitors in person, on the phone we had Shirley Olsen.

SHERIFFS REPORT

Mayor Olsen reported that Mackay had a total of 122 City patrol hours, Stanley had 142 hours, and Challis had 283 hours. In the coming years the City of Mackay may want to meet with Challis, Stanley, and Clayton regarding the contracts with Custer County Sheriff.

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Olsen presented the Council with Ordinance No. 462 Disturbing the Peace to be approved. Questions and concerns from the Council about Ordinance No. 462 were addressed.

Councilman Wallin made a motion to approve, Councilman Wall seconded it. The motion passed unanimously. Mayor Olsen then read the Ordinance.

Fees for Building Permits were discussed. Mayor Olsen will draft a Resolution with the new fee amounts to be approved at the January Council Meeting.

Council Member Reports

Councilman Wall: O.W. Park, industrial park- Wendell West has been busy but will do the heat tape in the O.W Building space that Konnex is renting. Councilman Wall had received requests from individuals in the area of Fullmer Lane and Lambson Road to install a stop sign on Fullmer lane due to increased traffic. Request for a stop sign on Fullmer Lane was declined by Council members. Councilman Wall made a motion to extend contracts of Businesses in the O.W. Business Park for 1 year with no rent increase, Councilman Wallin seconded it. The motion passed unanimously.

Councilman Wallin: City water and sewer-Nothing new at this time, will work with Chardon and Duane and will follow up with Council at next meeting.

Councilman Mangum: Parks department- nothing happening with the parks, check on welding of the gate at the Tourist Park. Councilman Mangum reported on the work of a volunteer group who had trimmed the trees on the burm at the airport in preparation for putting up Christmas lights. Lighting

should take place tomorrow night (12-09-2020). Mayor Olsen thanked Richard and asked for a list of the volunteer names so he could post a thank you on the Mayor Facebook Page.



- ✓ November minutes- Councilmember Wall made a motion to approve the meeting minutes for November, Councilmember Mangum seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.


Mayor's Report
