## Remote Learning Outcomes

Statistics show that fully remote learning students tend to be absent more and so do hybrid students compared to those that have in person class. This along with many other items were found in a national survey by the RAND

Corporation "Edweek" research center. During the pandemic, all students have lost out of learning time. Many students have fallen behind and may need to repeat a grade. Chicago Public Schools has instructed principals not to retain students this year. This survey found that one in five schools were fully in person, one in five fully remote, and the other three-fifths were a hybrid combina-

tion of the two.
The RAND Corp.
found 90% of fully remote students also had at least one in person class per day, but fully remote schools offered on average 110 fewer minutes of

English/Language Arts and 80 minutes less in Math and 40 minutes less of Natural Science than schools that were fully in person. All these categories have less time than in previous years. These are national averages and may not include schools with which you are involved.

Report says it realizes that some families are capable of subsidising these minutes with help at home. Some have educators in the family who are on call. Teachers reported that in fully classrooms missed up to 15% of the

curriculum they would hope to cover in a normal year. Some stated working with the in-home students allows them to prepare better lessons. Many have no travel time, no hallway monitoring and no bathroom monitoring. Therefore, leaving more time to prepare better les-

sons.
Technology is always a challenge. Many schools have their own Technology person on site, but what about the in-home students and the teachers? Nearly half of the remote learning teachers have experienced problems more than once a day and 80% say that the internet was reliable enough to still deliver instructions.

Principals reports say that they believe that the in person learners are still missing about 4% of suggested curriculum, but hybrid students are missing 8% and those fully remote are losing 20%. They noticed that the attendance does show significant problems especially among the remote and the hybrid students. They still expect these to be offered for at least one more year. This is not universal, as 15 states and New York City passed laws that will not allow remote learning next school year.

As we approach 2021 22 remote learning is still an option for many people. It has become a convenience and sometimes venience and sometimes necessity for some families. Sometimes the teachers need to watch elderly parents or they, themself are better physically capable to deliver the product from home and others can avoid payand others can avoid paying for babysitters. Students in some families are in multiple schools and it becomes quite easier to have them under one roof.

I have talked to many parents and teachers locally. Those that are considering remote learning again have more personal reasons than you can count. One thing a parent told me that I would not have thought was that some schools do not have uniforms and they used to worry about the "style police". If your family has a choice, please consider everything. As of now, the parent makes the ultimate choice and I am sure they will use it wisely.

### Art Exhibit At Morton Arboretum



The Morton Arboretum's new outdoor art exhibition, Human+ Nature connects people and trees.

Renowned artist Daniel Popper created five 15- to 26-foot-tall sculptures that will be featured in various locations across its 1,700 acres, leading guests to areas they may not have explored before.

On the East Side, a short walk from the Visitor Center, guests will be able to step within a huge female figure, as if into the heart of nature. Continuing along a less than mile-long walk, they will encounter a majestic maternal figure as tall as a tree, and a sculpture of diverse human facial traits interwoven with

root structures.

On the West Side, two hands joined by intertwining roots will extend near a grove of old oaks, and a towering force will and a towering face will evoke the interconnected ness of humans and trees. Made of glass-reinforced concrete, fiberglass, and steel, each sculpture will weigh several metric tons. The largest ground

footprint will be 28 feet wide and 37 feet long.

Trees have the power to refresh and restore people, to connect them to the natural world. They provide clean air to breathe, shade to cool, and beauty that can bring joy and relaxation. In turn, trees need people to care for them if they are to thrive and share their benefits.

Daniel Popper is a multidisciplinary artist known for his largerthan-life sculptures. From Cape Town, South Africa, he is most acclaimed for his massive public art installations, including the memorial sculpture for the Nelson Mandela School of Science and Technology in the Eastern Cape of South Africa, and sculp-tures for popular events such as the Boom Festival in Portugal and

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## Lakefront Beaches Open To Labor Day

The Chicago Park District will continue to utilize the flag notifications system and interact web page to display swim stawater quality, weather date, location information, amenities, directions and historical details about each of the 26 lakefront beach loca-

The following flag notification system tells patrons the current status of beaches: Green - Swimming is permitted. Weather conditions are fair and water quality is good. Yellow - Swimming is permitted, but caution is advised. Weather conditions are unpredictable, or bacteria levels are higher then the water quality criteria set by EPA for notifying the public.

Red - Swimming is not permitted. Weather conditions or water quality conditions are dangerous.

Additional signage that reads "Swim Only When Lifeguards Are On

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State Board of

Duty" is installed on every lifeguard perch last year to reinforce swim guidelines. Flag poles are also placed on all swimming beaches. Lifeguards will post a red flag at the end of the night to remind patrons that swimming is no longer permitted. That flag will remain in place throughout the night until the state of the next lifeguard shift.



The wall is divided into a beginner and advanced wall with three types of bouldering, climbing: lead-harnessed, and top rope. Climbing is a twoperson sport, so while instructors offer certifi-cation and private lessons, they recommend coming with a friend for bouldering, top rope climbing, and lead rope climbing.

Alll first-time participants must attend a certification class. Two types of certification are offered: bouldering certification costs \$15 and lasts about 15 minutes long, and top rope climbing certification costs \$29 and lasts 45-60

The Ribbon is free to use with your own equipment - nonmotorized scooters, rollerblades and roller skates. Rentals of roller blades and scooters are available at \$12 for half hour. #### **Archdiocese Plans** Pre K-Language

The Archdiocese of Chicago, in partnership with the Alliance for Catholic Education at the University of Notre Dame, will launch a pilot program next fall, the Early Childhood Language Intensive Preschool to offer daily core students instruction in Spanish, Polish or Mandarin Chinese to Pre-K students.

"There is solid research indicating when you teach students at the Pre-K level with multilingual instruction, it tends to stay with them in later years, said Dr. Katy Lichon, director of Catholicy School Advantage and English as a New Language at Notre Dame. "Moreover, the stronger you are in your first language, such as Spanish, the stronger you'll be in learning a second or third language."

Eight schools offering 30 minutes to an hour of daily core lessons in Spanish are Annunciata, St. Bartholomew, St. Bede the Venerarable: St. marv of the Angels, Our Lady of Guadalupe; St. Nichols of Toldentine; St. Richard and Pope John XXIII. St. Therese will offer a curriculum in Mandarin Chinese and St. Zachary will provide instruction in Polish. Teachers at these schools will train on the new curriculum this summer with assistance from Notre Dame.
