If you feel led, please pick up, or order extra, when shopping to help keep the pantry stocked. All types of staple items are needed. It is especially helpful to have complete meals with meats already packaged in them, or canned meats. Donations for the pantry may be dropped off at the Center on Lancaster beginning January 4.

For our Shoebox ministry this year a total of 278 boxes were filled and delivered to residents of nearby nursing homes. This is such a meaningful project for those without the support of family.

The Center hopes to be able to begin receiving donations for the Quarter Store after the first of the year and open the store back up. While the city is red due to the virus, precautions will remain in place. Once we go to orange, or yellow, the store will be available. Thank you for your patience during this time.

#### God's Unchanging Mind

"But he is in one mind, and who can turn him? And what his soul desireth, even that he doeth" (Job 23:13).

## Call to Order

-The Meeting was called to order by Eddie Duke. Pastor Jerry Carter welcomed everyone and read Hebrew 12:25-29 and emphasized the need to listen to the Lord. -Members and guests were encouraged to sign in.

**Recognition of New Staff and Board Members:** Sorgo Baptist new board member is Linda Gregory and Friendship Baptist new Pastor is Ben Everly.

*Approval of Minutes from Previous Board Meetings:* The Minutes were approved with a motion from Marshal Hatfield and a Second from Dennis McFadden.

**Finance Committee Report:** Bro Farrell Isenberg presented the finance report with the following corrections to the printed report. The Budget Needs for months \$232,225.62, Receipts from Churches \$217,353.18, other gifts \$1,842.88, Total Receipts \$219,531.06, Disbursements \$181,987.39. Budget Difference \$12,694.56. The report was approved on a motion.

**AMS Report**: Nathan Whisnant, along with a written report of his activities, gave a report about evangelism training and how every church can plant and church and the needs. He asked for prayer for the Pastor David Hocker of Greenbriar as he recovers from sickness and the interim pastor, Jackie Perkins.

## Reports of Ministries:

-Bro. Jerry Carter gave a Jail Ministry Christmas For Kids report about how churches can be involved by giving \$15 gifts cards from Walmart or the Dollar Store. This will be Bro. Jerry's last year. A special Thank You to him for his many years of service in this ministry.

-Cortney Brown shared about the work at Camp Schafer. Some fall retreats are being plans and 6 weekends are scheduled with churches. There is a Student Outdoor Experience that is scheduled for Oct. 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup>. This will be a hunt and camp adventure. Anyone interested may call and sign up. Any churches that would like to schedule an event, please call Cortney.

Old Business - There was none.

## New Business-

**Personnel:** Joanna Shake made a motion and a second from the personnel committee to enter a 3-year partnership with the KBC, KY Wesleyan and the DMBA for Connor Reed to serve as Ky Wesleyan Campus Minister. This motion passed.

-The Personnel Committee presented a motion and a second to hire Gail Boling as the Baptist Center's Director. This motion passed.

-The Personnel Committee presented a motion and a second to allow the AMS Director to teach a 13 week class called *Imagine Not As Much* if the opportunity arises either on Wednesday night or Sunday night, This motion passed by a vote of 19 to 14.

**Nominating:** Gerald Peeples presented a motion with a second to approve the Nominating Committee's Report of Officers, Committees & Program Units. This Motion Passed.

**Finance:** Farrell Isenberg presented a motion with a second from the Finance Committee to approve the 2020-2021 DMBA Budget. This motion passed.

-Farrell Isenberg presented a motion with a second to purchase a 75" Sony Smart HD TV, with sound bar, cabling, surge protection, adjustable wall mount, warranty and professional installation at an estimated cost of \$3,500 (Cost based on Best Buy estimate) be purchased with Legacy Funds and installed in the Baptist Building. This Motion passed.

**Program Committee:** Steve O'Neal presented a motion with a second from the program committee. In consideration of COVID 19 circumstances, the first night of the Annual Meeting on Oct. 19, 2020 be held as scheduled SAFE and in-person at Macedonia Baptist Church. All the business that needs to be conducted and voted on will be held this evening. The committee recommends that churches RSVP to Leslie at the DMBA office by Oct. 1<sup>st</sup> so we can assist Macedonia in preparing for this meeting to be conducted in accordance with COVID 19 restrictions and guidelines.

Also, that the second night of the Annual meeting on Oct. 20, 2020 that was originally scheduled at Living Faith Baptist Church to be changed to a virtual meeting with ministry reports. There will not be any business conducted at this meeting. This meeting will be pre-recorded and broadcast via Facebook on the evening of October 20, 2020 and will be available to all churches on the website after that. This Motion Passed.

**Correspondence to the Executive Board**- Karns Grove is still taking used Sunday School Material and other religious books to be shipped overseas to missionaries.

*Adjourn-* The meeting was adjourned on a motion from George Chinn and a second from Marshal Hatfield. Gerald Peeples closed with a prayer.
