CTU and CPS have Tentative Agreement

In this article I try to discuss things for par-ents, teachers and stu-dents. This week they will hopefully start school for in-person learning. This comes after several other pronouncements other pronouncements. The Board and the Union have a tentative agreement to resume in-person learning starting this week.

Most CPS parents have or will receive information about this agreement. Many of our readers do not have elemen-tary school age children so I try to simplify it for them. There is no final agreement on the start of

high_school. The times for our students are even crazier than that for adults. The sooner we worry about this, the better. Every creditable poll I found that is not more added that is not sponsored by CPS or CTU has shown that a vast number of parents wanted to return to in-person learning. Yet, when given a chance to register their students for the program, very few did. There could be many reasons for that. I hear that they have been off for so long, families have adapted and now many of them depend on those kids to help babysit so that parents can go to work or even take care of elderly family members.

There are still a few obstacles before the agreement is ratified. But there is hope that the following dates are as firm as possible. In the elementary program, Pre-K and students in intensive and moderate cluster classes will return February 11th. Students in K - Grade 5 will return March 1st and students in grades 6 - 8 return March 8th. Families should pre-

return to class. Both groups, CPS and CTU, satisfied seem with restrictions, and cleanliness. It is possible that one or both of these groups have tried your patience. But now they agree to open in person and protocols used to decide if future actions are needed. Efforts are being made to bring the vaccine to teachers, staff and students. Hopefully, this does not mean other people in Group 1B, which is a high risk group, will have to wait too much longer to receive

their vaccines. Lenny Bernstein in the Washington Post, used stats from the Center for Disease Control that since March of last year nationwide only 51 children, aged 5 -14 have died from the Coronavirus. There were approximately 5,000 who died of all reasons. While this is terrible for the 51 families involved, it is pointed out that 522 committed suicide in this period and that the highest reason for children to die was homicide, drown-ings and fire. All of us who have or are involved with children always want to protect as best we can. Once again, I stress that parents must make the ultimate decision for their students, but we, as concerned citizens, should be prepared to help these families when needed.






