



## Must We All Agree On Covid-19?

Trying to keep current with educators around the country you never know where you will find some interesting material. The following was part of a speech that came from a Hillsdale College National Leadership Seminar in Phoenix this past February.

Dr. Scott W. Atlas was the speaker that seemed interesting for us entitled "Science, Politics and Covid: Will truth prevail?" His credentials include a BS from University of Illinois Urbana and his MD from the University of Chicago. He presently is a Senior Fellow at the Hoover Institute at Stanford University. He stated that following accepted norms most people have been good at adhering to guidelines like social distancing, wearing masks and cleaning both ourselves and at locations we might go to in groups.

The following are things he said but are not necessarily directly quoted. He believes we should acknowledge that the CDC has reported large increases in depression, doubling our suicide rate, and the AMA believes hundreds of thousands of child abuse cases have gone unreported because of so many school closures. Covid has health causes because of the economic stress and restrictions that have been

placed in our lives. These have been appearing in both children and adults. Those considered experts on TV have been very depressing. Now that the vaccine is getting to a million people a day, these experts, many of which are calling for tighter restrictions again, and educators and medical personnel believe this will only add more pressure.

Among his comments include how academia has been severely limited in what they are allowed to say. If your view is different in any way to the people in charge, you might be ridiculed, and intimidated. Some are afraid to speak out about anything that is not 100% on the party line.

The reason I mention this is because it shows that academia should be arguing points scientifically. They are working in labs and working on the present vaccines and the next vaccines. We have been led to believe that these scientists must take the steps that will help all of us. If the medical community is afraid to rattle cages, we are losing some possibly great insights that could be helpful to all of us. We are all individuals. You do not have to believe everything Dr Atlas believes. After all we do not have the same history he has in the medical field. However, I believe we should agree with his right to think unlike his colleagues. I hope you adults can help the children accept other ideas and not be afraid to voice your opinion.

We realize the first expert was Dr. Fauci. He has changed his mind on at least seven situations with Covid that I am aware of. That's good. We should all be able to change our minds because this is something we have never lived through. I will never agree with those that are openly racist or do not believe in the Holocaust (my Dad helped liberate a camp in 1945). 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**Mauldin Art At Pritzker Museum**

The Pritzker Military Museum & Library, 104 S. Michigan ave. announces its newest exhibit, "Drawn to Combat: Bill Mauldin & the Art of War," which will celebrate the artistic career of cartoonist Bill Mauldin beginning May 14th.

A two-time Pulitzer Prize winning artist. His cartoons embodied the spirit of the infantryman during World War II before turning his critical pen to those in the political sphere. It will features 125 original Mauldin drawings, another 35 reproduced images, and more than 20 original artifacts.

For nearly fifty years, from World War II to the end of the Cold War, Mauldin used his artistry and wit to provide commentary on the world as he saw it. As a soldier and nationally syndicated political cartoonist, he used his voice and platform to critique the policies and actions of the nation's

leaders, both military and civilian.

Through his characters Willie and Joe, he was able to capture the cultural nuances of life in the Army, providing comedic relief or trepidation while presenting the grim reality of the war to the home front. On his return stateside, he found success as a political cartoonist for the St. Louis Post-Dispatch, and then at the Chicago Sun-Times. His famous cartoon reacting to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy in 1963, showed his continued ability to tap into the cultural zeitgeist of the time.
