\$100 Million For Energy Assistance

New System For State Hiring

The Illinois Department of Central Management Services and Department of Innovation & Technology announced a new human capital management system designed to streamline the application and hiring process. SAP SuccessFactor's recruiting module, will enable agencies to hire applicants faster and features an enhanced user experience to keep applicants better informed throughout the process.

The former hiring processes were 99% paper-based and labor intensive on applicants and hiring agencies.

The Department of Innovation & Technology managed the design, configuration and implementation of the new recruiting module.

A fully electronic application process will encourage the selection of the most qualified candidates and allow applicants to track where they are in the hiring process.

The system is supported by a recruitment website at work.illinois.gov, where applicants can create a user profile, learn more about opportunities to work for the State of Illinois and get assistance with procedures. Many programs are designed to assist veterans and people with disabilities.

In the latest high-profile field trip, four penguins from Shedd Aquarium visited *The FRIENDS Experience* on Michigan Avenue – a nostalgia-packed space dedicated to the popular TV show.

The birds walked through exact replicas from the recognizable set, experiencing new sensations and sights, like Joey's stuffed toy penguin Hugsy, adding variety to their day as part of the aquarium's welfare plan, for the penguins.

The FRIENDS Experience will reopen to the public on Wednesday, March 17th. The experience focuses on providing a safe environment through the use of timed ticketing, regular cleaning and sanitization, temperature checks and the

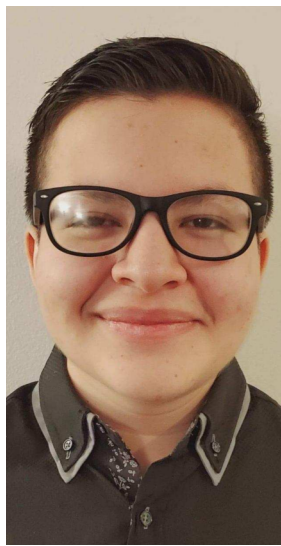
Ayuso Awarded Full Scholarship

Meet sea otters, penguins, or sea lions from home during a Virtual Animal Encounter. Two links for \$69.95, share this experience with a friend or family member.

Families can log-on from the comfort of their home for "Zzzs Under the Seas" a Virtual Slumber Party with Shedd for \$125 per household. Explore all aspects of aquatic life, including up-close looks at animals at Shedd in their habitats or behind-the-scenes, and participate in hands-on activities, games and more. The next morning, enjoy breakfast with the belugas and yoga with the fishes.

Virtual Aquarium Adventures for grades K-5 will cost \$39.95. Meet animals up close, explore Shedd Aquarium habitats and participate in hands-on activities, games and more.

Assistance With Tax Preparation

Low-to-moderate income families and older Illinoisans needing assistance filing their 2020 individual income taxes can receive free help through several trusted programs across the State of Illinois. The Internal Revenue Service and AARP Tax-Aide programs are providing free basic income tax return preparation with electronic filing to qualified individuals. How taxpayer assistance is provided and when services are available varies by region, based upon several variables including COVID-19 conditions and volunteer capacity.

The IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance and the Tax Counseling for the Elderly programs offer free tax help for individuals making \$57,000 or less, persons with disabilities, limited English speaking taxpayers and individuals 60 years of age or older. Taxpayers can search for a free tax assistance provider closest to them by visiting the Illinois Department of Revenue's website tax.illinois.gov. Additional assistance is also being offered through the IRS-sponsored Ladder Up Virtual Tax Assistance Program, which also provides free basic tax return preparation for low-to-moderate income and elderly taxpayers.

The AARP Foundation Tax-Aide program provides free tax assistance to taxpayers over the age of 50 or who have low-to-moderate income. Availability is determined at the local or community level, by appointment only (walk-in service is unavailable this year).

Decisions on whether a site offers an all-virtual, light contact or in-person approach will be based on safety and health data from Johns Hopkins about COVID-19 levels in a community. The site locator will be regularly updated, and short notice changes are possible. AARP membership is not required to receive assistance. Various taxpayer
