# Students May Have Grief or Depression

The recent annual of In School Conference American Counselors Association had several speakers dealing with schools reopening with the special interests in students returning to school that are suffering from grief and depression.

The Association expects school counselors to be overwhelmed with these issues. Part of it is due to how many students have lost a parent or two due to Covid 19. This is above and beyond the normal loss of life and the Center for Disease Control has on various between 40,000 and 119,000 children have lost a parent during the pandemic.

The number is hard to determine because there are so many ways that families are constructed in our present society. Many kids have more than one or two people they consider important to them. Parenting is done by step parents, grandparents, aunts and uncles, and even non-relatives living in the house-

hold. The children may suffer and have deep personal feelings with any of these

Travel restrictions during the pandemic had certain students not allowed to visit their dying relatives and in some cases, not even allowed to attend funerals. These happenings affect our students in many different ways. Of course, it varies by age of the students and the family structure, but even students living in the same household because of age differences have had different experiences in their lives. Their wide ranges of student responses to grief and depression. Here are a few but it is far from exhaustive. We look for changes in the character,

like crying, feeling sad all the time. The student is no longer his or herself and may have become loud or quieter. Maybe they no longer show interest in their normal activities or even show hostility towards friends or pets.

If it is a loved one with these signs, be prepared because you are also susceptible to these reactions because you also experienced the death in your family. Your doctor may be a good source to start because it is hard to get psychiatric help right now. Many in the field are overworked and not accepting new patients. Remember, seeing a counselor does not mean that someone is crazy. But there may be an ill-

ness that an expert can deal with that you are not prepared for. When school starts, let the appropriate person there know of your concerns. It might be the counselor or the case manager or the principal. This can help the family.

Cook County Legal Aid for Housing and Debt helps residents resolve foreclosure, eviction, debt, and tax deed issues.

The federal moratorium set by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and local eviction moratoriums put in place by the State of Illinois expired on July 31st. Landlords could file eviction papers within the Cook County Courts beginning on Aug. 1st and all aspects of evictions can move forward on Sept. 1st, meaning judges can order evictions and the Cook County Sheriff's Office can enforce orders.

# \$185 Million for **Rental Assistance**

As the state's gradual phaseout of the pandemic eviction moratorium continues, the Illinois Housing Development Authority has distributed more than \$185 million in emergency rental assis-tance to 22,200 persons through the Illinois Rental Payment Program. The review of all 70,000 applications re

70,000 applications received during the first application round in June, has been completed with an additional 25,000 applications in the pipeline to review from the second round. Landlords with inprogress applications already initiated by their tenants are encouraged to complete their portion of the application before the deadline on Sunday, Aug. 15th.

Early in the pandemic, Governor Pritzker announced a statewide eviction moratorium for tenants while launching emergency assistance programs that included extensive relief for renters, landlords, and homeowners. From July to December 2020, IHĎA provided \$230.6 million in emergency rental assistance to 46,129 households and \$98.5 million in emergency mortgage payment assistance to 10,071 households.

A new round of rental assistance in May 2021 delivered more than \$500 million to 63,000 households. On July 29, the Governor signed landmark legislation that created new programs and

incentives to support affordable housing throughout the state, including a new \$75 million program to finance affordable rental housing in areas impacted by the pandemic.

The Illinois Department of Human Services has programs available to households in need and has awarded over \$187 million in assistance for more information visit: www.illinoisrentalassistance.org.

An Executive Order allows eviction filings against covered persons to begin on Sunday, August 1. The current prohibition on enforcement of eviction orders entered against covered persons will remain in place until Tues-August day, 31st. Enforcement of eviction orders entered against covered persons will be al-

lowed September 1st and beyond. The Illinois Supreme Court has issued an order temporarily staying all trial and judgments in residential eviction proceedings involving covered persons, with some exceptions. The order takes effect August 1st and expires September 1st, 2021.
