
SF Deltas fight back to win first game in team history

On a windy night in San Francisco, the Deltas came out cold and soon found themselves facing their first deficit ever. In the 23rd minute, two North Carolina shots were saved by Deltas goalkeeper Romuald Peiser before NCFC's Tiyi Shipalane hit

Both teams probed to regain the lead in the second half, with the Deltas having the better opportunities. They finally found the


