



## Memorial Day, Thank Them All

Why do people serve in the military? It has been a complicated question ever since we existed as a nation. Some were drafted, some patriotic, and others enlisted because it was just the right thing to do. We owe a debt of thanks to all who served. All enlistments are vital to our safety and security. Of course, those who were in combat. Ask those who were in combat and they will tell you that both sides can be courageous and deserving, win or lose, their country's thanks even if that country no longer exists.

The question comes out today because of the "cancel culture" efforts. If the person displayed great sacrifice and bravery and saved many lives in his home state, but had inherited a slave, does that then negate his efforts to help his neighbors fight off those that had invaded their homeland? Remember, our southern border has more people trying to enter the United States than ever recorded. They have counted at least citizens of 142 nations fleeing their own countries to enter the US. Remember when TAPS is played at Arlington, all gave some, some gave all.

## Emergency Rental Assistance Program

The Chicago Department of Housing opened the third round of rental assistance for tenants and landlords since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Emergency Rental Assistance Program includes nearly \$80 million funded through the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriation Act signed into law by Congress in December 2020 and will offer up to 15 months of rental assistance and utility payment assistance for renters.

Chicago's ERAP, along with other county and state assistance programs are designed to keep renters in their homes as well as avoid the kind of multifamily foreclosures that were seen in the wake of the 2008 economic crisis. Since the onset of the pandemic, eviction moratoriums at the state and federal levels have provided some protection to tenants who have lost income. Last week, Governor Pritzker announced that the state moratorium on pandemic-related evictions will be phased out by August. During this time, landlords have also struggled to pay their bills due to reduced rent collections.

DOH has partnered with The Resurrection Project which will provide case management services to administer 75% of the funds through an online platform designed by Unqork. Additional intake and application processing will be performed by over a dozen delegate agencies and

### Archdiocese Plans Pre-K Language

The Archdiocese of Chicago, in partnership with the Alliance for Catholic Education at the University of Notre Dame, will launch a pilot program next fall, the Early Childhood Language Intensive Pre-school to offer daily core students instruction in Spanish, Polish or Mandarin Chinese to Pre-K students.

"There is solid research indicating when you teach students at the Pre-K level with multilingual instruction, it tends to stay with them in later years," said Dr. Katy Lichon, director of Catholicity School Advantage and English as a New Language at Notre Dame.

"Moreover, the stronger you are in your first language, such as Spanish, the stronger you'll be in learning a second or third language."


Eight schools offering 30 minutes to an hour of daily core lessons in Spanish are Annunciata, St. Bartholomew, St. Bede the Venerable; St. Mary of the Angels, Our Lady of Guadalupe; St. Nichols of Toldentine; St. Richard and Pope John XXIII. St. Therese will offer a curriculum in Mandarin Chinese and St. Zachary will provide instruction in Polish. Teachers at these schools will train on the new curriculum this summer with assistance from Notre Dame.


