## The Battle For Good Education

There are many issues in education. We must see to it that whether we have children or not, our young ones are given the best opportunity available. Some things seldom hit the news, but can affect all of us. In Virginia, some Board members are forcing schools to shelf books in their libraries that parent groups sight as being about pedophilia. The books even include explicit directions for acts that many of the parents find offensive. After this, the parents were called terrorists and that is said to have cost the governor his job in that state,

In Arizona, a School Board replaced a Board president for keeping records of all parents he considered dissidents and against his administration. You will find situations like this throughout the country, but this is the first one I know of where the Board presi-

Here in Chicago, our Board of Ed is not yet elected. So schools just get mandates because these are voluntary positions and they only are assigned by the mayor, and, therefore, are accountable only to her. Let's not forget the teacher in front of your kids because it's those in the trenches that will teach the children the importance of education. Once the kids can read and write, they can hopefully comprehend the issues of the day.

## Chicago Announces Vaccine Requirements

foot, the Chicago Department of Public Health, and Chicago Department of Business Affairs & Consumer Protection announced that any individual 5 years of age or older will be required to show proof that they are fully vacci-nated against COVID-19 dine indoors, visit gyms, or enjoy entertainment venues where food or drink are being served. This new requirement goes into effect on Jan. 3rd, in response to a rise in cases, driven in part by the Omicron variant.

Mayor Lori E. Light-

The mask mandate also remains in effect for all public indoor settings. The order will remain in effect until Omicrondriven surge and the risk of overwhelming hospital capacity has passed.

The vaccine requirement does not include houses of worship; grocery stores (though indoor dining sections within gro-cery stores would be included); locations in O'Hare International Airport or Midway International Airport; locations in a residential or office building the use of which is limited to residents, owners, or tenants of that building; or food service establishments providing only charitable food services, such as soup kitchens. Schools and day cares also are not included in the order.

Proof of vaccination means a CDC COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card or an official immunization record from the jurisdiction, state, or country where the vaccine was administered or a digital or physical photo of such a card or record, reflecting the person's name, vac-cine brand, and date administered.
