Groundbreaking For Park District Headquarters



In fall of 2018, the Chicago Park District announced that it would relocate its District Headquarters from the downtown area to the 14th Ward in Brighton Park. Alderman Burke, along with other City officials, attended a construction ground breaking ceremony on the former site of Wilson's Steel and Chicago Tube and Iron at 48th and Western ave.

The Park District Board purchased 17 acres of land for a 54,000 square foot administrative building. The proposal also included plans for a 19,000 square foot recreational center, three soccer fields, an entertainment venue for musical events and a children's playground and spray-pool area.

MFDC Receives \$140,000 Grant

The Mexican Folkloric Dance Company of Chicago <http://www.mexfoldanco.org> was awarded a Chicago's Cultural Treasures Grant of \$140,000 from The MacArthur Foundation, The Joyce Foundation, The Polk Brothers Foundation, The Terra Foundation for American Art, The Walder Foundation, The Ford Foundation and Philanthropist MacKenzie Scott.

Chicago's Cultural Treasures is a four-year initiative to support our city's BIPOC-led and -focused arts and culture organizations as they face unprecedented challenges to their decades of leadership and resiliency.

\$14.4 million was awarded to 40 organizations that contribute to the history, culture, vibrancy, and identity of communities of color in greater Chicago. Funding For Rental Assistance

The ChicagoCity Council passed an ordinance amending the 2021 Annual Appropriation for Fund 925 grants for \$102 million of federal funding for Chicago's Emergency Rental Assistance Program. The funding will be used for a fourth round of rental assistance, through the Department of Housing. Fifty percent of the total amount must be obligated by March 31, 2022.

Up to 10% of the total funds can be used for housing stabilization services, and assistance does not have to be associated with financial impacts due to COVID-19. DOH will have through September 2025 to issue grants.

The third round of emergency rental assistance program resulted in a total of 26,843 applications during the three-week open application period. ERAP1 includes nearly \$80 million funded through the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriation Act signed into law by Congress in December 2020 to provide up to 15 months of rental assistance, 12 months of past due payments and three months of future payments, and utility payment assistance for impacted renters.

Assessor's Office Recognized

The Cook County Assessor's Office has been recognized with a 2021 Achievement Award from the National Association of Counties for its work in moving its paper-driven operations onto more user-friendly digital platforms.

Up until 2020, the assessment of more than 1.9 million parcels relied heavily on paper applications and forms. For the first time in the history of the Assessor's Office, applications for both property tax exemptions and assessment appeals were fully accessible online.

Under the leadership of Cook County Assessor Fritz Kaegi, the office made a significant leap forward in the technological modernization of the third largest assessment jurisdiction in the nation.

"This is a huge milestone toward the full modernization of our office. We launched both of the new online appeal and exemption systems just prior to Illinois' Stay at Home order due to COVID-19," Assessor Kaegi said. "The launch of online applications ensured the safety of the public and our employees while maintaining a high level of service."

To date, the office has processed approximately 125,000 digital appeal applications and approximately 130,000 exemption applications. The implementation of these online tools is part of a larger project to enhance the technology used by the Assessor's Office, which will streamline administrative processes for staff and make the property tax system more accessible for taxpayers.

The digital innovation efforts of the office were submitted for consideration under a program titled "File Smarter, Not Harder: How the Assessor's Office Went Digital" in the category of Information Technology.

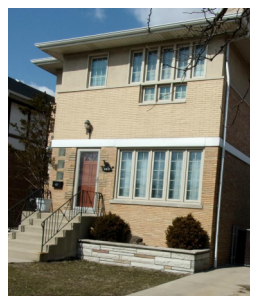
